



One-on-One Insurance Counseling is available at the Senior Center through SHIIP upon request. The Senior Center can assist with making these appointments. NOTE: Appointments are available by appointment only and are subject to the availability of a certified SHIIP Counselor.

Prescriptions Drugs? Medicare beneficiaries may be eligible for the federal Extra Help/Low Income Subsidy program if he/she has limited income and resources. You may apply online at www.socialsecurity.gov, or contact the SHI-IP (Senior Health Insurance & Information Program.) office toll free at 800/443-9354 and we may assist them with completing the on-line application process or send them a paper application.



Poppy Seed Ham Rolls



3/4 cup melted butter
1 1/2 tablespoons Dijon mustard
1 1/2 teaspoons Worcestershire sauce
1 1/2 tablespoons poppy seeds
1 tablespoon dried minced onion
24 mini sandwich rolls
1 pound thinly sliced cooked deli ham
1 pound thinly sliced Swiss cheese

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Grease a 9x13-inch baking dish.

- 2. In a bowl, mix together butter, Dijon mustard, Worcestershire sauce, poppy seeds, and dried onion. Separate the tops from bottoms of the rolls, and place the bottom pieces into the prepared baking dish. Layer about half the ham onto the rolls. Arrange the Swiss cheese over the ham, and top with remaining ham slices in a layer. Place the tops of the rolls onto the sandwiches. Pour the mustard mixture evenly over the rolls.
- 3. Bake in the preheated oven until the rolls are lightly browned and the cheese has melted, about 20 minutes. Slice into individual rolls through the ham and cheese layers to serve. 24 Servings
