YVEDDI Head Start Children Receive Christmas Gifts



Preparing your child for Kindergarten

The Head Start school year end is fast approaching. It is important to start early with routines to help prepare children for Kindergarten. Here are a few suggestions that you can easily implement to begin the process:

- Set a morning routine getting up at the same time every morning allowing enough time to get ready and eat breakfast before leaving for school.
- Set an evening routine going to bed at the same time every night. Allow some quiet time before bed to unwind. Reading a bedtime story is a great way to settle down before bed.
- Read to your child every night. When children start Kindergarten they will have books to read every night. Start the routine now so it will be easy to continue.
- Set consistent limits on screen time. Children should be limited to short periods on the computer, cell phone or tablet. TV time should also be limited and you should try to seek out educational shows.

I hope you find these tips helpful and easy to implement.

YVEDDI Weatherization Assistance Program

The Department of Environmental Quality has designated funds to assist low-income families and individuals to have adequate heat in their homes and to reduce their utility costs by means of weatherization.

The Heating Appliance Repair/Replacement Program (HARRP) can repair or replace a heating system that is functioning below the manufacturer's standards. Weatherization includes installing insulation, sealing air leaks, and performing measures that will reduce energy usage.

To meet the financial requirements for assistance, the gross house-hold income for the last 12 months cannot exceed 200% of the Federal Poverty Index.

Coping with Autism

<u>Autism</u> belongs to a group of developmental disabilities called <u>autism spectrum disorders</u>. The name "spectrum" stems from the fact that these disorders affect each

child differently. These disorders involve delays in the development of many basic skills, including the abilities to socialize or form <u>relationships</u> with others and to communicate effectively. Children with <u>autism</u> may also have intellectual disabilities and behavioral challenges.

Tips for parenting children with Autism:

Learn All You Can About Autism

Because <u>autism symptoms</u> and behaviors often change over time, treatment strategies are tailored to the child's needs and available family resources.

Get a Strong Social Network

<u>Parenting</u> a child with any chronic illness is emotional; it affects every part of your being. But the day-to-<u>day care</u> of children with autism is especially stressful because of the lack of essential social interaction and communication between the child and adult. For many reasons, you need to find strong social support for yourself, as well as for your child.

Teach Your Family About Autism

Training family members about autism and how to effectively manage the symptoms has been shown to reduce family stress and improve the functioning of the child with autism.

Review the Recommended Autism Treatment Options

<u>Child development</u> experts agree that a child with autism should receive treatment as soon after diagnosis as possible. There is no cure for autism, but early intervention using skills training and behavior modification techniques can yield good results.

Learn More About Behavioral Training

Both behavioral training and behavioral management use positive reinforcement to improve behavior. These therapies also use social skills training to improve communication. The specific program should be chosen according to the child's needs.

Assess Your Child's Need for Medication

While there is no medication for autism, there are drugs for specific symptoms that kids with autism might display. For example, short attention spans can sometimes be improved with stimulant drugs that are used to treat ADD or <u>ADHD</u>. Children with autism who have <u>anxiety</u>, <u>depression</u>, or <u>OCD</u> behaviors can often be treated with antidepressants.

Learn More About Diet Changes

Diet changes are based on the idea that food <u>allergies cause</u> symptoms of autism, and an insufficiency of a specific vitamin or mineral may cause some autistic symptoms. If you decide to try a special diet for a given period of time, be sure you talk to your pediatrician and a registered dietitian. The child's nutritional status must be as-

sessed and carefully measured.

Use Caution With Unproven Therapies for Autism

The safety and effectiveness of some therapies used to treat autism are not known. Many unproven treatments circulate through websites, word of <u>mouth</u>, or the media. Most have not been subjected to thorough, sound research and are considered nonstandard and controversial

Plan Time for Breaks

Many parents of children with autism feel exhausted, overwhelmed, and sometimes defeated. They talk about difficulties in their marriage and other <u>relationships</u>. Schedule regular dates with your partner, other children in the family, and close friends.

IDEA - the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (p. L. 102-119) was passed by Congress and requires that all states and territories provide a public school education to children with disabilities from ages 3 to 21, no matter how severe their disabilities are.

This law promises to children with disabilities a "free appropriate public education" at public expense, that their educational placement is based on an evaluation of each child's own special needs and that an Individualized

Education Program (IEP) is planned for your child and states the services they will receive. If you have a child with disabilities be sure they are receiving the special education they deserve.

Kids Indoor Activities: Obstacle Course

Indoor Obstacle Course

By Trish Kuffner, author of The Children's Busy Book As you design your obstacle course, keep in mind the ages, abilities, and number of children involved as well as the space you have. Make the course simple at first and change the stations as they're mastered. If you like, time the kids to see who can complete the course fastest. Below are a few ideas to get you started. Ten stations is a good number for most kids.

Directions

Crawl under a row of chairs.

Crawl under a string stretched between two chair legs. Jump into and out of a Hula-Hoop five times.

Throw a beanbag into a laundry basket.

Run/Walk while balancing a beanbag on your head.

Do a ring toss.

Ride a tricycle along a predetermined route.

Do a handstand.

Skip in place while reciting a jump rope rhyme.

Do ten jumping jacks.




Congrats!
