All of the Head Start facilities hold a **fivestar license** from the N.C. Division of Child Development and Early Education, signifying them as offering the highest possible quality of child care in North Carolina.

We place intense focus on school readiness by involving teachers, the children and their families. Our educational program focuses on physical health, social and emotional development, literacy, mathematics, science, creative arts, language expression, social studies, logic and reasoning, and English language development.

We work with the public school system and other entities to ensure that children with diagnosed disabilities receive the necessary services to help them succeed . All services are free to families who meet Federal Poverty Index Guidelines.
